GUIDELINES FOR CONTRIBUTING AUTHORS

Authors submitting articles for publication in the *AMERICAN BAPTIST QUARTERLY*

- Must send an electronic file [Preferably in Microsoft Word] to the editor:

- Must edit articles to be no more than 23-24 pages (notes included), double-spaced, 11 point font, with notes gathered at the end of the manuscript
- Must conform to the fifteenth edition of *Chicago Manual of Style* or the seventh edition of Kate Turabian, *A Manual for Writers*
- Should not include a bibliography
- Must include a 100 word abstract
- Must provide a corrected electronic version & final copy of accepted articles (Our printers prefer Microsoft Word. Contact Robert Johnson, Editor, if you must use another program.)
